

Lace spinning on the Aura

Some things I've learned while using my Aura is the Lace Kit works amazing with her. I've successfully spun up to 80wpi using the 2nd largest groove on the lace kit whorl. I'm sure someone with better skills with fine spinning could easily use the smaller grooves to obtain the fine weight they desire. I've found that 2 completely full lace bobbins fits perfectly plied on the standard jumbo bobbin the Aura comes with.

Here's my settings for my lace weight and some examples I've spun with these settings.

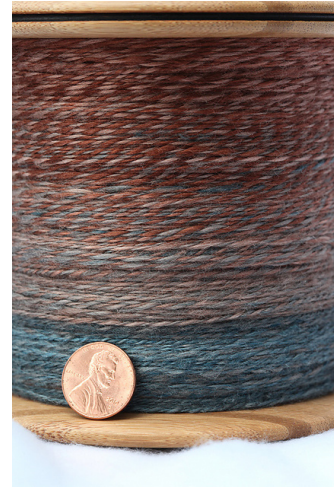
Settings for Singles

Bobbin Drive - groove 1
Flyer Drive - groove 2 on lace whorl
Tension 25%

Settings for Plying

Bobbin Drive - groove 1
Flyer Drive - groove 2 on normal whorl
Tension 25%

2 ply - averages around 27 wpi (don't have the WPI for the singles)



Navajo ply - 80wpi singles 20 wpi 3ply



When using the lace flyer with the hook on the right side where it's supposed to be I've found that at the back of the bobbin it doesn't add on at the very end of the bobbin and have found that if I switch the hook to the left side it'll add onto the bobbin at the back more evenly.

As soon as I finish a couple lace weight projects I'm working on I'm hoping to do some experimenting with different weights and spinning techniques and want to make a sample notebook to keep with a yarn sample along with the settings for future referencing.
